I. Introduction:

- A. How do the plaques increase in intensity

II. Main Argument

- A. Solemn Warning (vv. 1-4)
 - 1. <u>Identical Demand (v. 1)</u>: what is your purpose and how is that reflected in your daily life?
 - 2. Plague Promised (vv. 2-3)
 - a. What does the word plague mean?
 - b. What is the significance of frogs?
 - c. How extensive was this plaque?
 - 3. Suffering under the plague (v. 4)
 - a. How might Pharaoh might have exempted himself from the previous plague; why is that no longer possible?
 - b. <u>Application</u>: How would life in the Promised Land be different for Israel here?
 - c. **Application**: Why does God, under the New Covenant, sometimes (often) allow His people to suffer along with the nation where they live?
- B. Chaotic Reality (vv. 5-7)
 - 1. <u>Pharaoh's Disobedience (vv. 5-6)</u>: where did all these frogs come from?

- 2. <u>Magicians Summoned (v. 7)</u>: why does this suggest Pharaoh is beginning to worry?
 - a. What was Pharaoh responsible to do for Egypt, and how are the plagues demonstrating his failure?
 - b. What are the Magicians able to do?

C. Borrowed Prayer (vv. 8-13)

- 1. <u>Time Elapses (v. 8a)</u>: What must Pharaoh do to end the crisis?
- 2. <u>Pharaoh's Education (v. 8)</u>: what has Pharaoh learned about Yahweh thus far?
- 3. Moses Boasts before Pharaoh (vv. 9-11)
 - a. How does Moses give Pharaoh the advantage?
 - b. **Application**: is it ever appropriate for us to put God's reputation on the line in this way?
 - c. Why might Pharaoh have asked for the frogs to disappear *tomorrow*?
- 4. Moses Prays for God's Glory (vv. 12-13): what is Moses' attitude in prayer?

D. Death Everywhere (vv. 14-15)

- 1. Why does Pharaoh change his mind?
- 2. What does Pharaoh teach us about access to God?
