  - Q. How does holy baptism remind and assure you that Christ's one sacrifice on the cross benefits you personally?
  - A. In this way: Christ instituted this outward washing and with it promised that, as surely as water washes away the dirt from the body, so certainly his blood and his Spirit wash away my soul's impurity, that is, all my sins.







Called Congregational Meeting Nov. 30, 2025 For the Purpose of Electing a Pulpit Committee

# The Session of FPFO recommends the following particulars to facilitate a smooth pulpit committee election process, in keeping with BCO 20-2:

- A pulpit committee consisting of members from the congregation at large shall be designated and duly elected by the congregation at a congregational meeting. The only church officers to serve on the committee will be those nominated and elected by the congregation according to this process.
   The election shall be conducted by secret ballot, which will include a list of
- submitted nominees and space for additional floor nominees nominated during the congregational meeting for the pulpit committee selection.

  3. In order for nominees to have their names printed on the ballot, they need to be submitted in person or via email to the clerk of Session by 11 p.m. Friday, November 28 (with the prior consent of the nominee's willingness to
- 4. Nominees must receive a majority (over 50%) of votes in order to serve on the pulpit committee.5. If the congregation desires for the committee to have a certain number of

serve on the committee). Floor nominees may be written on the ballot as

- members, it may establish that number by action from the floor during the congregational meeting. If not enough nominees are elected, the congregation may hold another election later to add members or modify the desired number for the committee. If more nominees secure the required majority than the established seats on the committee, those nominees who receive the highest number of votes shall be selected to fill the committee.
- 6. Votes will be tallied by the Deacons and Clerk of Session with results announced later in the day on Sunday, November 30.
- 7. When nominating members to serve, members should keep in mind the roles that may be needed on the committee which include a chairman, vice chairman, and secretary. Please see PCA Administrative Committee document outlining the common duties of a pastoral search committee as a reference.
