





A Note About the Hymns

Paul continues to dwell upon the "sociological" work God has done in Christ in Ephesians 2:11-16. Under the Old Covenant, humanity was divided between the Hebrew versus the Gentile, but that ethnic division was merely foreshadowing what God would do in Christ. God has created a new humanity in Christ, the Israel of God versus the world.

The holiness of the Hebrew Commonwealth was designed simply to point forward to the Church, which includes people from every tribe and nation, every blood on the same basis: the blood of Christ. The Apostle celebrates that work in Ephesians 2:14-16 with the removal of the "dividing wall of hostility."

We begin our worship singing praise to the Triune God whose praise will occupy our attention for all eternity thanks to the faithfulness of Christ.

In response to the Assurance of Pardon we sing from Psalm 22, which looks forward to the day when all the ends of the earth will turn to God, which is the very thing we see happening now, since Christ has been lifted up He has drawn all people to Himself.

In preparation for the preaching, we sing a 17th Century Scripture Song based on Isaiah 40, which rejoices in the coming of the Messiah to the earth. The prophet looks forward to the day when the Glory of the Lord in His salvation shines not only in Galilee or in Jerusalem, but over all the earth.

We respond to the preaching of God's word by singing Psalm 67, which again foretells the blessings of God's saving grace extending through the whole earth and worship being offered to Him from all the peoples.

The Hebrew Scriptures clearly held forth the expectation God's kingdom would include people from every nation. Jewish prejudice and hostility to the Gentiles caused them to ignore this great hope. But the Apostle in Ephesians 2 celebrates the fulfillment of God's ancient purpose to unite all peoples under His Son, the Seed of the woman, the Offspring of Abraham, and the Son of David in whom all the peoples find blessings: our Lord Jesus Christ.
