Summer Adult Sunday School Course

"What comes to mind when someone mentions 'meditation? Have you given much thought to the immensely helpful practice of *Christian* meditation? Thomas Watson observed, "The devil is an enemy of meditation . . . He knows that meditation is a means to compose the heart, and to bring it into a gracious frame." James Ussher counseled people over 350 years ago: "One hour spent [in meditation], is worth more than a thousand sermons, and this is no debasing of the word, but an honor unto it." This summer the adult Sunday school class will be using David Saxton's book, *God's Battle Plan for the Mind: The Puritan Practice of Biblical Meditation*, as a tool to guide us in the practice of Christian meditation. We may also think of this series as an extended, practical application of Romans 12:2: to be transformed by the renewing of the mind. The book is short, which will allow ample time for discussion and examples for consideration, so please join RE Bowers as he leads this study from June 4 through August 27.
