- *The Confession of Faith Heidelberg Catechism No. 79
 - Q. Why then does Christ call the bread his body and the cup his blood, or the new covenant in his blood, and Paul use the words, a participation in Christ's body and blood?
 - A. Christ has good reason for these words. He wants to teach us that just as bread and wine nourish the temporal life, so too his crucified body and poured-out blood are the true food and drink of our souls for eternal life. But more important, he wants to assure us, by this visible sign and pledge, that we, through the Holy Spirit's work, share in his true body and blood as surely as our mouths receive these holy signs in his remembrance, and that all of his suffering and obedience are as definitely ours as if we personally had suffered and made satisfaction for our sins.

The Prayer of Confession

Lamb of God, who takes away the sins of the world, have mercy upon us, forgive us, refresh us. Give us a true sense of our sin, which made your sacrifice necessary. We have not loved you with all our heart, nor have we served one another as you have served us. Earthly comfort surrounds us, and we treat too lightly the pain and anguish you endured for our salvation: your betrayal, your lonely agony, your false trial, your mocking and scourging, and the torture of your death upon the cross. As You have given Yourself utterly for us, may we give ourselves entirely to You, O Jesus Christ, our only Lord and Saviour.

For All the Saints


They will rest from their labor, for their deeds will follow them. Rev. 14:13






